Our topic for today is "CHANGE" and the "VOTER". First of all what type of Government do we have today? Most answered, we have a "DEMOCARCY"; and what is a democracy? "It's where the people vote for change and the majority vote wins" So I asked our voters, "What type of government were we told we had by our founding fathers?" No one could answer this question! "A Republic" If one looks up "Republic" it too offers the voters a vote and the majority votes win. So what is the difference between these two governments? Here is an easy way to remember the difference, a Republic contains the peoples Rights given by God's people and any majority vote of the state legislators cannot alter the peoples Rights. What rights are we talking about? For starters let's consider the "Bill of Rights", tenth amendment, in federal constitution and money, land, law in dejure state constitution; second let's consider our citizenship, under the Republic as state citizens and not Federal citizens. Why? Your states were first to be recognized in history and then later a federal bureau of representatives was added to represent the United States congress in international and interstate trade and this body was not given the power to create citizenships. As a voter you voted within your state only and your state legislators would send representatives to U.S. congress assembled to vote. "So what happened?" In 1781 our bill of rights was adopted by the newly created federal government to respect the people's rights, our republic lasted from 1781 to 1860 some 79 years. Then we had a federal regime war not a war between the states. The southern state representatives left the federal congress and organized their own federal congress regime because the northern regime would not follow the constitutional republic states rights. This war for regime's lasted from 1861 to 1863. Now what type of government came out of this war, it surely was neither a **confederacy** nor a **republic** state, it was a federal marshal law rule by military provisional international government organized under 1866 Civil rights federal rather than the people's united states of America rights. This form of government is with us today; so as a "voter" you authorize its existence each year by voting for it; understand you have enslaved yourselves and your neighbors in *private federal international* statutory law by your silence or unilateral contract signature. Again it's up to you, for this type of government is a failure and you keep voting it in "Why keep volunteering" on your ballet write "under protest" and exercise your right of refusal, signature done under Title 28, 1746-1.
